



CURRENT CHALLENGES

STRAINED RESOURCES DURING CONCURRENT CALLS

When multiple emergencies occur simultaneously, current staffing levels strain resources and reduce the District's ability to respond at the optimal speed.

DISTRICT-WIDE COVERAGE GAPS

Without a second engine, response times and coverage throughout the District are stretched thin.

DELAYED RESPONSE TO STRUCTURE FIRES

With only 1 fire engine, RCFD must wait for mutual aid before safely entering a burning structure, meeting minimum safety staffing requirements.

REVENUES NOT KEEPING PACE

RCFD receives a relatively low share of property tax revenues compared to other San Joaquin County fire agencies, compounding the funding gap.

HOW THE ADDITIONAL FUNDS COULD BE PUT TO WORK



SECOND STATION

Staff and operate a second fire station - including personnel, training, and ongoing operating costs.



FASTER RESPONSE

Improve response times and coverage throughout the District, especially on additional calls.



SAFETY EQUIPMENT

Maintain and replace apparatus, medical equipment and protective gear needed.
